About LASAG

The London Asbestos Support Awareness Group operates across London and the South East. The Group was set up by The London Hazards Centre Trust Limited, a registered charity, established in 1984. LASAG obtained independent charity status in 2017. All of the services offered by LASAG are free.

Advice & Support

Our Support Workers are very experienced in supporting sufferers of mesothelioma and other asbestos related conditions, and understand the impact such diseases have on individuals and their families, both physically and psychologically. They are also knowledgeable about state benefits and compensation schemes, and maintain close liaison with other key professionals in the care of the sufferer and their families.

Home Visits

Our team are available to visit individual sufferers in the comfort of their own home, or can be contacted by telephone, to assist with paperwork and provide ongoing support and guidance.

Support Group Meetings

LASAG holds monthly support group meetings for sufferers and their carers to meet others undergoing the same experience. Our experienced staff, together with specialist guest speakers and other professionals will be available to provide information, advice or a listening ear in a safe and private environment.

Help With Compensation

We can signpost to legal advice and help from lawyers who are experts in dealing with asbestos disease claims.

What Is Asbestos?

Asbestos is a naturally occurring, fibrous mineral. It was used extensively in the UK from the 1900s. Due to its huge versatility, asbestos was moulded into many forms, including sheeting and cloth. Many people have been exposed to asbestos fibres through their own work, the work of colleagues near to them, washing a family member's contaminated clothing or living near to an asbestos factory. The exposure is likely to have taken place many decades ago. Not everyone who has been exposed to asbestos will develop an asbestos-related condition. However, for those people who do, it is important that they receive independent and impartial advice from specialists.





Asbestos Related Diseases



Mesothelioma is an incurable cancer caused by exposure to asbestos dust and fibre. It usually develops in the fluid in the lining of the lungs (pleural mesothelioma) but can also affect the lining of the abdomen (peritoneal mesothelioma) and the lining of the heart (pericardial mesothelioma).

Lung cancer can be caused by significant exposure to asbestos dust and fibre over a period of time. Lung cancer can have causes other than exposure to asbestos, the most common being smoking.

Asbestosis is the name for fibrosis in the lung caused by significant exposure to asbestos. This condition is caused when large quantities of asbestos fibres, over time, damage the inner structure of the lungs, resulting in breathlessness.

Pleural thickening is caused when asbestos fibres breathed in penetrate the lining or pleura of the lungs, causing thickening of this lining. This causes restriction to breathing because the lungs cannot expand fully.

Pleural plaques are areas of scarring on the lining of the lungs caused by asbestos fibres penetrating the lining of the lung. They may become more extensive but they do not develop into any other asbestos disease.

Please contact us if you have been diagnosed with any of these conditions. Time limits apply to civil compensation claims and for certain benefits, so don't delay.

Customer Commitment Charter

Legal Help and Compensation

If you or a family member have been diagnosed with an asbestos-related disease, you may be entitled to compensation. If you were exposed to asbestos in your workplace, it may be possible to bring a claim against your former employer, even if the employer went out of business a long time ago. Alternatively, your condition may have been caused outside of your work, for example from washing a family member's asbestos contaminated work clothes.

Whatever asbestos-related disease you have and however you believe it was caused, it is important that you obtain legal advice from a specialist solicitor. LASAG's carefully selected panel of expert solicitors will provide the right advice and will pursue a claim for you whenever possible. This legal service is FREE, whatever the outcome of the claim.

You may know how your asbestos exposure occurred but frequently, people don't recall where or how they were exposed to asbestos. One of the solicitors from LASAG's panel of specialist law firms will meet you at home and go through your work history and other possible sources of exposure to find out when, where and how you came into contact with asbestos.

Why claim? It has been known for many decades that asbestos was dangerous to health. From the mid 1960s employers knew it caused mesothelioma and other asbestos-related diseases and yet many employers took no precautions to protect their workers.

Compensation value: The aim of compensation is to put you in the same financial position as though you hadn't developed mesothelioma. Although the amount awarded in each case is different, the amount of compensation is usually substantial.

Timing & Time Limits: A claim should be brought within three years of the date of diagnosis or within three years of the date of death. Asbestos related compensation claims are dealt with as quickly as possible by our panel solicitors and the Courts have fast track procedures in place for dealing with asbestos claims.

Legal Fees: If the case is successful then the organisation paying your compensation will also pay your legal costs. If your case is unsuccessful then there is no charge to you. Our panel solicitors will explain how the costs work when they meet with you.

How can LASAG help? We can signpost you to expert solicitors who specialise in asbestos disease claims. To be on our specialist panel, they have had to prove they are law firms which only represent people with asbestos-related conditions and never act for organisations defending asbestos disease claims.

Please note that LASAG does not accept any responsibility relating to the appointment of a solicitor. Each of LASAG's panel firms of solicitors are completely independent of LASAG.
